

Controlling App Windows

App windows have controls and features that are

similar in most programs:


- Quick-sizing buttons
- Menu buttons
- Title bar
- Window resizing
- Snap feature



Touch Controls


To check if a Windows 10 computer has a touchscreen, click Start→Settings→System→About.

Look for the Pen and Touch section.



Working with the Taskbar

- The taskbar runs the width of the Desktop at the bottom of the screen.
- The center section displays the apps that are open or pinned and the Start button.



Action Center (Notifications)

The Action Center is a central location for information being shared by various apps.

• Information includes news alerts and available updates.



Multitasking

- A computer can run multiple programs or operations at the same time, such as:
 - Checking email
 - Paying bills online
 - Playing music
 - Printing documents
- It can also run tasks and activities in the background, such as:
 - Downloading files
 - Virus protection
 - Updates
